

**COUNCIL MINUTES
REGULAR MEETING OF
WASHINGTON COURT HOUSE CITY COUNCIL
03/11/2020
7:30 P.M.**

Council met in regular session at 7:30 P.M. in the second floor Council Chambers located at 105 N. Main Street, Washington Court House, with Chairperson Jim Chrisman presiding. Mr. Johnson led the invocation. Mr. Blair led the pledge of allegiance.

Present at said meeting were, Mr. Joe Denen, City Manager, Mr. Mark Pitstick, City Attorney and Mrs. Kelley Ford, Clerk of Council. At roll call, the following Council members were present: Mr. Dale Lynch, Mr. Steve Shiltz, Mr. James Blair, Mr. Ted Hawk, Ms. Kendra Hernandez, Mr. Caleb Johnson, and Mr. Jim Chrisman.

Ms. Hernandez moved and Mr. Shiltz seconded the following motion:

COMMUNICATION

Mr. Denen advised that there were no communications.

PUBLIC HEARING

Mr. Chrisman opened the Public Meeting for discussion of the Joint Economic Agreement with Jefferson Township.

There being no discussion the public meeting was closed at 7:32pm.

COUNCIL COMMITTEES

Mr. Hawk presented the minutes of the Service, Safety and Recreation Committee meeting held February 26, 2020.

Mr. Lynch moved and Ms. Hernandez seconded the following motion:

MOTION: That the minutes of the Service, Safety and Recreation Committee meeting held February 26, 2020 be approved as presented.

Mr. Hawk expressed his concern regarding Council's meeting with Adena and noted he would like to meet with other entities as well.

Mr. Denen noted that Kettering indicated that if Council wished to meet that they would make accommodations.

Mr. Johnson advised that he was not opposed to meeting with Adena and other entities.

Mr. Shiltz noted that he was not opposed to meeting with both Adena and Kettering.

Mr. Chrisman reiterated that Council was not the deciding factor.

Mr. Lynch stated that Council does not have a say in the decision and that the meeting was for informational purposes for Council to answer questions from the public.

Mr. Shiltz advised the decision was totally up to the hospital board.

CITY MANAGER REPORT (in writing)

Mr. Denen respectfully addressed Council and expressed his gratitude for good weather.

Mr. Denen noted that mowing equipment was being placed in good order.

Mr. Denen noted that road salt was in good supply. Mr. Denen continued and stated that surplus salt will be stored at the old Service Garage. Lastly, Mr. Denen advised that due to a minimum order conundrum with cooperative purchasing with ODOT, the salt order will need to be re-evaluated for the 2021 supply.

Mr. Denen noted that the paving bid would be advertised.

Mr. Denen reported the recent hire of Mr. Jason Copas for the Police Patrol Position.

Mr. Denen reported that the Police Department was operating on the new software platform.

Mr. Denen noted that extra traffic enforcement was being done in the vicinity of Dayton Avenue.

Mr. Denen reported that the Fire Department had been evaluating potential sites for a training tower for 2021 or 2022.

Mr. Denen noted that the shelter house construction near the splash pad would commence soon. Mr. Denen noted that the tentative opening date would be around Memorial Day; weather permitting or other considerations.

Mr. Denen noted that Leigh Cannon from the Fayette County Health Department would be addressing Council. Mr. Denen noted that the City of Washington Court House had been communicating diligently with the Fayette County Board of Health. Mr. Denen encouraged cooperation from all entities with the Fayette County Board of Health.

Ms. Leigh Cannon, a representative from the Fayette County Public Health Department addressed Council and discussed the status of the current COVID 19 pandemic. Ms. Cannon stated that the Health Department was working closely with the Governor and CDC regarding risk assessment and appropriate action. Ms. Cannon noted that the goal of the Health Department was to do whatever could be done to slow the spread of the virus.

In discussion, Mr. Blair advised about the memo from Governor DeWine regarding the closure of facilities and events that would produce large crowd. Leigh noted that the Governor will send out further guidance as to what to expect and be done.

Several questions arose from Council. In conclusion, Ms. Cannon noted that the public needed to do their part addressing the pandemic, the public needs work well with guidance given by the Governor and the local Health Department. Ms. Cannon continued and stressed that if the pandemic reaches a local level, (Fayette County) the calvary was not coming to the rescue and that it would take the community working together to overcome the pandemic. Ms. Cannon noted the importance of slowing down the virus.

Council thanked Ms. Cannon for the update.

Mr. Denen, noted that the JEDD Legislation would need to be on hold for third reading due to the timeline of the Ohio Revise Code.

Mr. Denen introduced Lego League students and Mrs. Anne Ginn. Students respectfully addressed Council and advised of a club project to help trash clean up at Eyman Park. The students continued, and noted that a school wide survey was completed and identified the need for trash clean up at Eyman Park. The Lego Club members advised of a possibility of a competition between both Miami Trace and Washington School Districts that would encompass school color trash cans being placed within the park and a clean up of not only regular trash, but micro-trash. The students inquired if Council would be willing to purchase additional trash cans for Eyman Park?

The members of council and Mr. Denen responded.

Council thanked the students for their presentation.
