Flor & Co, the floral studio of downtown

Catherine Yeoman recognized a need, had a vision, and opened a flower shop on S. Main Street in October of 2023. After the business flourished, she required more space and relocated to the corner building of 101 S. Main Street, enhancing her work space and public visibility.

She carries a diverse selection of large and small flowers and plants, catering to various floral needs for homes, businesses, and special occasions. She specializes in creating unique arrangements, and balloon art. The plastic-type balloons (that don't easily pop) can be filled with an array of items, such as candy, money, flowers, plants, small balloons, etc., tailored to the event, such as baby showers, graduations, or anniversaries.

Catherine and her store manager, Abigail Thompson, create flower arrangements tailored to customer needs, and her family plays a role in the business by providing delivery services. Flor & Co. has two part-time employees, and five additional as-needed staff members who assist during busy holiday seasons and wedding preparations.

Catherine has commissioned artist Duane Richard of Wilmington to paint a mural on the Court Street side of the building, having been approved by the Historic Downtown Review Board. The mural features a hummingbird and flowers and will be funded by Flor & Co., the Ohio Arts Council, Fayette Travel and Tourism, and the City of Washington Court House. The mural will begin as soon as weather permits, with the goal to having it completed by June of this year.

Catherine said, "I love the relationships that come with being in the floral industry." Prior to opening her flower shop, she spent 12 years in the healthcare industry in various positions. Catherine also owns the Good Dog Groomer/Unleashed Dog Boarding Suites located on East Court Street. She has done dog grooming for several years and employs four groomers at her facility.
